SEA-EU SUMMIT in the framework of Innovazul

On Friday 2 December, the main activity of the European University of the Seas took place in Innovazul, the SEA-EU SUMMIT on the capabilities and opportunities for collaboration in the territories of the Alliance.

The day included a session in which the vice-rectors of research of the partner universities shared their capabilities in the field of blue growth. This was followed by a session of short presentations on specific topics related to ocean sustainability. Vincenzo Piscopo from the University of Naples Parthenope, Juan Miguel Mancera from the University of Cadiz, Ulrike Kronfeld-Goharani from the University of Kiel, Goran Ćorluka from the University of Split, David Zammit from the University of Malta and Pedro Morais with Ines Cerveira from the University of Algarve presented their main research results related to marine energy, sustainable coastal tourism or aquaculture, among others.

The attendees then had the opportunity to meet the new associate member of SEA-EU, the World Maritime University.

The last part of the session consisted of a panel where representatives of cities, ports, companies and research centres of the SEA-EU territories, including, among others, Teófila Martínez, president of the Port Authority of the Bay of Cadiz, José Luis Rodríguez Zaragoza, president of the Marine Maritime Cluster of Cádiz, or Martín Vila, Town Planning Councillor, shared their ideas and capacities for international collaboration.

The aim of the round table was to share what PhD's and companies are looking for and what they are missing when recruiting qualified personnel. This event counted with the participation of Laura Martín (Coordinator of the Doctorate programme on

Marine Management and Conservation), Pablo Quero (Energy Agency - Provincial Government of Cádiz), Mercedes García (TECNOAMBIENTE), Erik Malta (CTAQUA), Beatriz Díaz Garduño (Entrepreneur). The round table entitled "Skills beyond academia" included the experiences of these professionals and a very enriching conversation about the skills that PhDs can offer to the labour market in the field of private companies.
